How Claims Spread - Joel Best 2001

Best's anthology examines for the first time how diverse social issues—road rage, the metric system, gun control, and abortion are among those included—migrate across national boundaries, modifying themselves from place to place as a result of different claims, claimsmakers, and policy responses. They are intended to suggest that the diffusion of social problems is neither simple nor automatic.
